10. ___ I am responsible for my personal and academic standing and do not rely on parental involvement to be successful.
11. ___ I seek help from my teacher or an outside source when necessary.
12. ___ I will put in the extra time required to successfully complete a class.
13. ___ I attend school on a regular basis.
14. ___ I stay engaged during class and have strong note-taking skills.

Scores of 14-42: Scores in this range may indicate that you do not possess the skills required for success in dual enrollment at the time.

Scores of 43-55: Scores in this range indicate you might be ready for dual enrollment, however, some areas require improvement.

Scores of 56-70: Scores in this range may indicate you have the skills to be a successful dual enrollment candidate.
